Seventh Grade Literature Sections A and B Summer Reading Assignment 2017

Lit Sections 7A and 7B are required to read Upside Down In The Middle of Nowhere by Julie T. Lamana. Students are required to answer the questions for this novel that are attached to this information sheet. The novel has been divided into 4 sections. Each section completed is worth 10 points, so the whole packet will be a grade of 40 points due on the first day of school August 9, 2017. I designed the questions on the worksheets to follow the story being read. In other words, the questions are in order and should not be hard to find or answer if the novel is being read. In class, we will discuss the novel and check all questions. Then, a written test on this novel will be given during the second full week of school. (100 points)

In addition, students will select a second book of their choice from the list below. An Accelerated Reader test will be taken on this novel the first full week of school. (50points) In Lit class, students will need to have knowledge about the main characters, the setting, the major problem or conflict and how it was resolved, the plot, and theme or lesson learned about this second book. Students should take notes on these items because in addition to the AR test; they will take a written test on these items in class the first week of school. (50 points)

Students should select **one** of the following novels to read:

Stormbreaker by Anthony Horowitz

Between Shades of Gray by Ruta Sepetys

Surrounded by Sharks by Michael Northrop

The Fighting Ground by Avi

Night of the Howling Dogs by Graham Salisbury

One for the Murphys by Lynda Mullaly Hunt

In summary:

All students must read two books.

All students will take the following tests:

- a 100 point test on <u>Upside Down In The Middle of Nowhere</u>
 - a 50 point AR test on the second novel of their choice
 - a 50 point written test on the second novel of their choice.
