NOTE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Matthew 5:16 asks each of us to “Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.” This week’s focus during Morning Prayer reflection has been on the importance of giving and serving others. Questions asked of each one of the students is to think silently in their hearts, “How has God been generous to you?” and “How can you help someone today.”

The St. Jude Beta Club and Community Cougars have organized a “Jeans for Greens” fundraising effort to raise money for hurricane relief. According to NCEA (National Catholic Educational Association) more than 150 Catholic schools were in the storms’ path of destruction. The funds raised on the “Jeans for Greens” day will be used to help Catholic schools impacted by the storms to rebuild, reopen and re-enroll students.

The “Jeans for Greens” fundraising effort is a powerful opportunity to engage our students in living the Gospel message of compassionate service to others. In keeping with this call, they are encouraged to make a donation of a minimum of \$1.00, but more will be happily accepted, to participate in a Free Dress Day on Friday, September 22, 2017. The proceeds we raise will be sent to NCEA Student to Student Campaign. 100% of funds collected will be distributed to dioceses in the affected areas for their Catholic school communities.

The faculty and staff of St. Jude appreciate your generosity in helping support the good work of the Beta Club and Community Cougars and this learning experience for our students, who can make a real contribution to their peers whose lives have been turned upside down by this disaster.

NO BUS SERVICE: EBR Transportation will not be available on Monday, October 9th. There will be NO BUS SERVICE on this day.

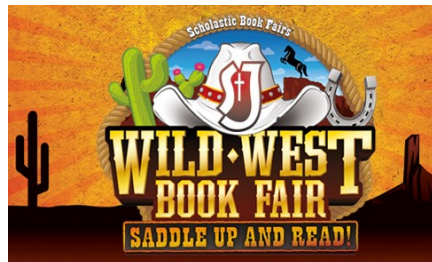

HANDBOOK POLICY REVISION PG. 28: A student's hair shall be of moderate uniform length and must be neat and clean at all times. Styling for both boys and girls must be simple, symmetrical and conservative (no hair tails; beaded braids or feathers; large, unkempt styles; line cuts; shaven heads; etc.). A boys' haircut should be above the ear, a ½ inch above the eyebrow, **a transition line from short to long should not be visible** and side burns should be short, neat and trimmed at all times. Middle school boys should be clean shaven. Tinted, bleached, highlighted or dyed hair is not acceptable. "Sun-In" products which alter hair color are not acceptable. The Administration makes the final decision in all matters of dress and grooming.

ORTHOPEDIC APPLIANCES: Students sent to school with an orthopedic appliance such as a cast, sling, brace, splint, crutches, etc., must bring a note from the physician regarding diagnosis and activity restriction. If a student is sent to school with an appliance before seeing a doctor, please send a note stating that an appointment has been made. This is a precautionary measure for the safety and well-being of your child and other students.

UPDATED PARTY & EVENT GUIDELINES: New to the student handbook this year (page 30): “No peanut products, including peanut oil or any products containing peanuts, may be served at class parties or special events. Guidelines are provided to room mothers each year. Parents should reference The Cougar for class parties or special events for students.”

Home & School is increasing our efforts to communicate to parents what food items are being served at our events. When there is a school-wide event with food items being served, H&S will publish what is being served in The Cougar prior to the event to allow parents time to review and make accommodations if needed. In addition, all room mothers are being tasked with setting their party menu early and working with the teachers to insure the list of items being served at class parties is communicated to the parents in advance. The room mothers are informed of the school policy regarding no peanut products and are advised to avoid all nut products. We recognize that some allergies require more specific accommodations and we will work with families that choose to supply substitutions for their child. Please note, while every effort will be made to notify you of items being served, it is incumbent upon the parent to contact the teacher and room mother with any questions or concerns prior to the event.

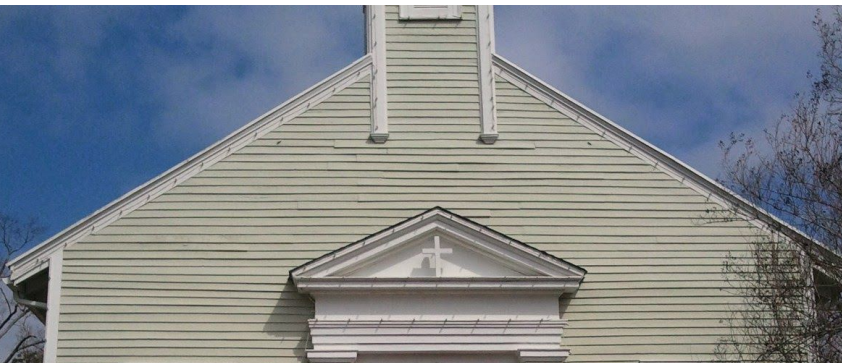

Learn-Practice-Teach-Encourage...Justice Is the Key to Creating Safe Communities for Children



The Virtue of Justice

What is Justice? Justice is the virtue by which we give to others that which belongs to them. Justice safeguards the rights of others, which are based upon the reality that each human person is made in the image of God. Our dignity is derived from our nature.

Why Practice Justice? Justice assures harmony in our relationships: family, society, work, church and others. We are equal in dignity and this dignity is deeper and richer than our ethnicity, heritage, culture, race and economic background. At the core of our being, we desire to be treated fairly and equitably. Justice is necessary in order to respect the order and dignity of societal and personal relationships.

Each person has the right to life, freedom, home and property. Each person has the right to worship God. Each person has dignity and the right to their good name. When our actions in daily life recognize and provide for these rights, we live justly.

Evidence that I am living in Justice every day may include...

- I tell the truth at all times, even when it is difficult.
- I draw in others who are left out of games, conversations and plans.
- I may be tempted to cheat or steal, knowing I will not be caught, but decide to be just and honest.
- I respect the space, time and boundaries of others. I do not use others, or anything about others, for my pleasure or satisfaction.
- I repair or replace anything I break or loose.
- If I hurt someone's feelings, I ask for forgiveness.
- I am aware of, and practically concerned for, anyone who is abused, neglected, exploited or used.
