Dear Parents,

As we approach the week of April 29th to May 3rd, I would like to inform you about the upcoming Terra Nova Standardized Test that students in 3rd-8th grade will be taking. The Terra Nova test is an important assessment tool that helps us gauge your child's academic progress and identify areas where they may need additional support or enrichment.

The test schedule is as follows:

April 29th – Math (Part 1) April 30th – Math (Part 2) May 1st – Reading (Part 1) May 2nd – Reading (Part 2) May 3rd – Language

Testing on these days will begin promptly at 8:00 am

Additionally, we wanted to inform you that standardized test scores for students in 5th-8th grade will be included in the high school application process. These scores will serve as part of the comprehensive evaluation to ensure the best fit for your child's academic journey.

To ensure that your child is well-prepared for the Terra Nova test, here are some important test preparation ideas:
