- Read the novel <u>Fahrenheit 451 by Ray Bradbury</u>. Both an Accelerated Reader quiz and an in-class written test will be taken on this novel the first full week of school. For this novel, you will complete a few brief activities for each of the three parts of the novel ("The Hearth and the Salamander," "The Sieve and the Sand," and "Burning Bright").
 - a. You will write <u>your own title</u> for each part. The title should reflect the plot of the given part.
 - b. You will write a 3-5 sentence summary of the reading.
 - c. You will also write one question that YOU have about the novel at that point.
 - d. You will write an original thematic statement about the reading.
 - e. You will find an image that represents a symbol, character, or theme of reading and explain its significance in one sentence. Your image must be different for each part.

This **MUST BE TYPED & DOUBLE-SPACED**. <u>You will turn this in on the first day</u> <u>of class</u>. Please see the attached example for formatting.

(2) Choose a second book from the list below. <u>Complete the attached notes page after you read the book.</u> You will take an AR test on this book. It will be a grade for the first nine weeks. If a student took an A.R. test on the book during a previous school year, it will not count as summer reading for the 2025-2026 school year.
